Tooley Water District Board Meeting June 21, 2018

Carol opened the meeting at 7:21 pm. John made a motion to approve the May meeting minutes. Richard seconded. Motion approved unanimously.

Carole asked for approval of the June meeting agenda. John asked to amend the agenda to have item number 8 (Customer replacement of meter) moved up in the meeting agenda to accommodate the two guests (Mr. Wolfe and Childs). Debby made a motion to approval the amended agenda. Richard seconded. Motion passed unanimously.

Richard shared that he also was having an issue with his meter, as well as Mr. Wolfe and Childs and provided back up documentation for the last three months. The amount of water had consistently gone up dramatically and Richard indicated that they had not changed their water usage. He wondered if his meter was possibly over reading. Mr. Childs meter showed no water usage for the past few months. Mr. Wolfe shared that he had turned his water off during a prolonged time that he was absent from his property and that the meter still showed a water usage of 400 gallons. Board members discussed the three issues and especially commended Mr. Childs for his honesty in informing the board that he had not been charged. John shared that he had contacted Hiland when the issues had first come to him as an individual board member and that Hiland stated that meters can acquire "slippage" (meters age and begin to not read the accurate usage amount. This issue is typically in favor of the customer in that the water meter is reading lower than the actual amount used. John indicated that all 3 situations were completely different. Mr. Wolfe suggested the possibility of all three meters being read incorrectly. Mr. Childs felt that he had a faulty meter. Hiland provided an estimate of \$150 per meter change out. Board members continued to discuss the issue. John made a motion to have Tooley Water District replace Richards and use this situation to inform the board in developing a future policy regarding meter issues. Debby seconded the motion. Motion passed with Mr. Pontow abstaining.

John made a motion to authorize Hiland to replace meters in the event that Hiland believes it is in the best interest of Tooley Water District. Debby seconded. Motion passed unanimously.

John provided the financial update and shared that we had the following:

Checking \$12,287.84 Savings \$32,105.19

John shared that the \$300 bank error that was discovered last month had been corrected. John updated the board on the water loss figures. In April there was a recorded loss of 1,900 gallons. In

May the total loss was 144,390 gallons.

John provided information on the renewal of the Hiland contract. The contract included a 2% increase. This increase had been anticipated and was included in the new budget. The board also discussed having Hiland perform flushing maintenance and having Hiland double check the chlorine levels. John made a motion to accept the Hiland Water contract as presented. Debby seconded. Motion passed unanimously.

John updated the board on the valuation of Tooley Water District facilities. These amounts were comparable to those provided in the district's insurance coverage values.

John shared that new and additional water testing may be required from the state. We will know more in the future.

John provided board member reimbursement documentation and explanation.


Carol adjourned the meeting at 8:37 pm.

Item 5 - Discussion - Iron in the water

Mr. Wolfe contacted Mr. Amery regarding concerns of potential Iron in the water. Mr. Amery then contacted Tina at Hiland in an effort to gain a full perspective of the situation.

Iron is not an item that is required to be tested for by the EPA. It is however listed as a secondary standard regulation which the EPA sets guidelines for aesthetic considerations such as taste, color, and odor. Iron levels are considered to be within EPA secondary standards if they are below 0.3 mg/L. However, since Tooley Water District is not required to test, we do not know what our iron levels are.
