#### Tooley Water District January 21, 2021 Virtual Meeting

#### In attendance: John Amery, Larry Russ, Carol Mauser, and Debby Jones

Chairperson Carol Mauser opened the meeting at 7:02 pm

Carol asked for approval of the January meeting agenda. Larry made a motion to approve the agenda. John seconded. All approved.

Carol asked for a motion for approval of the December meeting minutes. Larry made a motion to approve the December minutes. John seconded. All approved.

John provided the financial report:

Checking \$ 5,393.93 Money Market \$52,178.26

John felt that revenue and expenditures were on target and shared checking updates that included two \$30 charges to the city of The Dalles which fell under maintenance and repairs. John anticipated potentially an additional \$50 a month charge for the additional nitrate testing. Carol asked if testing needed to continue since we were not utilizing the well in question. John felt it was a valid question and will follow-up with Hiland and the state.

Water report for December showed a water loss of 44%. Hiland indicated that there were inaccuracies in past readings and the 44% was more of a catch-up. The average water loss over the past several months is over the 10% desired average. Hiland has not indicated any concern over the amount. Larry questioned the numbers due to the amount of water sold in November compared to December.

There were no new updates regarding the Emergency Preparedness report.

Catch-up payments are occurring with the delinquent accounts. Questions were raised on the accuracies of the individual accounts regarding water sold and payments. John will reach out to Hiland to inquire as to the validity of the reports.

Larry contacted SDAO regarding the policy updates. SDAO has not posted the policy updates at the time of the board meeting.

Larry and John provided an update regarding the nitrate levels. Larry shared that the nitrate levels continue to fluctuate. Larry had a conversation with a water expert who shared that usually once the nitrate levels start to go up that they levels usually stay high – rarely see them go down to acceptable levels. Potential long-term options regarding the lower well and nitrate concerns include:

- Filtration System (Unsure if the filtration system can keep up with the high nitrate levels with the addition of having to burn through a large amount of water)
- Drill current well deeper (due to sandy soil, not a guarantee that it will work)
- Drill new well
- Develop new larger reservoir

Both John and Larry felt that the best solution may be to drill a new well. Both agreed that phase one of the project would need to be securing funding for a feasibility study to determine the best option. They met with representatives of Business Oregon as well as MCEDD to inquire about grant/funding options. Carol asked for rough budget numbers. John stated worst case scenario would be up to \$350,000 which would include the study and engineering. John and Carol also indicated that working with the farmers and measuring levels during the summer months can be a short-term option as we

are currently only having to only run one well during the winter. Board members discussed the responsibilities of the farmers, especially since the well had been producing drinkable water for over 50 years.

Debby made a motion to authorize board members Larry Russ and John Amery to work with Business Oregon, MCEDD, and any other viable loan/granting agencies in efforts to develop a potential funding source and associated plan for remediation of nitrate issues at the lower well. John seconded. All approved

Debby made a motion to authorize board members Larry Russ and John Amery to develop and submit a plan to OHA before the February 1 deadline. Carol seconded. All approved.

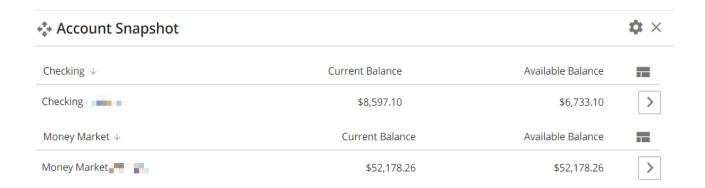
