#### Tooley Water District April 15, 2021 Virtual Meeting

In attendance: John Amery, Larry Russ, Carol Mauser, and Debby Jones

Chairperson Carol Mauser opened the meeting at 7:06 pm

Carol asked for approval of the April meeting agenda. John made a motion to approve the agenda as presented with the addition of an update by Larry regarding chlorine levels. Larry seconded. All approved.

Larry made a motion to approve the March minutes. Carol seconded. All approved.

John provided the financial report:

Checking \$ 3,790.28 Money Market \$52,184.69

John felt that revenue and expenditures were on target. No new maintenance and repair during the month.

Water report for March showed a water loss of 47.97%. This is the second month with a large water loss. Board discussed the concern of where the water is being lost. Hiland has not been able to determine the cause. The balancing act is how long we can continue with the large loss as compared to the cost to determine why the loss and necessary repair. Board discussed whether the electric bill was fluctuating with the larger amount of water going through the system.

Larry had a concern that the chlorine level may be high and shared with the board. He would like to check to make sure that the level is not too high. John said that he had not been testing and that he had shared that with Hiland. Hiland checks twice a month. The levels in the past have not been the same depending upon the location. Larry will get the kit and check the chlorine level at the reservoir.

Carol shared that she participated in the Hazardous Mitigation grant webinar. She shared that there may be some funding for generators. Board also discussed additional emergency issues such as if Hiland was not able to get to the area for a long period of time or there were some type of emergency where our infrastructure was damaged. The discussion centered on asking worst case scenario questions so as to be better prepared for the future. Larry suggested providing Tooley members possible guidance and suggestions to help them be better prepared as family/individuals for short term emergencies. Board felt that emergency preparedness is important but there are also pressing issues regarding the nitrate level, water loss, etc. that need to be addressed immediately.

Board discussed the delinquent account and if a meter should be pulled as well as if legal action such as a lien should be put on the property. No decisions were made but further policy discussions will need to occur. Board also discussed other delinquent accounts. Carol offered to see if there were any current community benefits assisting with utilities due to COVID.

Board discussed the new Hiland contract. The new contract shows an increase of \$40 a month. Debby made a motion to authorize Chairperson Mauser to sign the 2021-22 Hiland contract. Larry seconded. All approved.

John is working on development of the RFP for the feasibility study. Still waiting to hear back from Business Oregon for a final update on the SIPP grant that the district applied for.

Board discussed the current nitrate levels. No one was aware of a recent level. John will follow up with

Hiland for the most recent levels.

The board held a brief discussion on potential funding options and will continue to keep the list on the agenda for future discussions as needed.

There was no update on the fuel spill.


Next meeting is scheduled for Thursday, May 20. The budget meeting will be held before the regular board meeting at 5:30.



  - Assistance must NOT include actual engineering of systems
- Drinking Water Source Water Protection Projects
  - Can provide up to \$30k grant (and \$100k loan)
  - includes source water protection (SWP) land acquisition and other types of incentivebased source water quality protection measures.
- SIPP Applications due March 15
